LISTED PLACES OF WORSHIP SCHEME EXTENDED

The Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme (LPWGS) has been extended for one year and capped at £23 million

Under the extended scheme, individual places of worship are eligible for a maximum of £25,000 grant.

The Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme was launched in 2001 and has been extended by every government since then. The scheme provides grants covering the VAT on repairs costing more than £1000 to listed buildings used as places of worship. It was due to expire at the end of March and the announcement to extend it was made on January 22, 2025.

The diocese building and land teams have been active in supporting the call to extend the scheme including writing to local MPs to explain how important the scheme has been in protecting the 256 listed churches in the Diocese of Truro.

GROWING A CHURCH IN A CARE HOME

While the Covid pandemic may be five years ago now, the impact of it is still being felt in many communities. In Looe Valley Benefice, the repercussions of that time have had a surprising and positive effect in one place.

During the lockdowns the churches in the benefice had limited contact with the care homes in the area. As soon as the restrictions lifted, a decision was made to return to Hillcrest House care home and to provide worship for residents on a regular basis.

Revd Stephen Guffick, curate in the benefice, said: "As a church, we obviously value the prayers of those who can no longer get out to services, and we hoped regular short services in the home might help those residents feel seen, loved, valued and ministered to. This has developed, however, into something more resembling its own new church plant!"

Residents, alongside staff members, have started to help with choosing hymns and reading the lessons and intercessions. They have even created a hymn board. Relatives sometimes join in a service as well, and this month they have taken delivery of a new altar cross from a local community group, the Shedders.

IT IS ITS OWN CONGREGATION

Revd Stephen says: "There is no sense it is the local church doing a service for the care home. It is its own congregation within our benefice."

Johanne Thompson, activities coordinator at the home, says: "Our services are bespoke to our community. It gives residents spiritual recognition and pastoral care. Our residents take ownership of their services, they are happy to take on reading and construct and read out prayers."

When residents are unable to take part in the main service, they are visited for a chat in their rooms by one of the team, so that they can continue to benefit from pastoral care and a sense of being involved. The Hillcrest community has put back into the benefice too with collections and they contributed to the recent Christmas tree festival at Morval Church by making and displaying their own tree alongside the others on display.

The Hillcrest church, which meets on alternate Tuesdays, is regularly attended by 25 to 30 people including residents, staff, and the wider benefice congregations, with staff who are busy elsewhere even leaving prayers to be read out by residents on occasions.

AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE KINGDOM OF GOD

Revd Stephen added: "Services follow a familiar format of readings, prayers hymns, and a sermon of no more than two or three minutes, perhaps making this church the envy of many around the county! There is always a time of fellowship and prayer following each service and we all consider each other family. It is an important part of the kingdom of God in South East Cornwall."

VACANCY IN SEE COMMITTEE

With the announcement of our new bishop, the previous Vacancy in See committee, who did tremendous work towards that appointment, must now stand down.

We invite you to consider putting yourself forward to join the new one.

Every three years our diocese elects a new Vacancy in See committee. In accordance with the Vacancy in See Committees Regulation 2024, a committee should be in place at all times, in case of a vacancy in the office of the diocesan bishop. The term of the previous elected members of this diocese's committee came to an end on December 31, 2024 (being the year in which a new Diocesan Synod was elected).

The work of the Vacancy in See Committee in preparing for the appointment of a new diocesan bishop would be like the role of a PCC preparing a parish profile, but on a diocese-wide scale. Its work would require several meetings over a period of six months or so. Crucially, the committee elects six from amongst its number to form part of the Crown Nominations Commission, which decides who should be recommended to the Crown to be appointed as the next Bishop of Truro.

Its composition is a mixture of ex officio (x12) including the clergy and lay members who were elected to serve on the current General Synod and elected members. It is expected that there will be at least 21 members.

We will be shortly issuing details of the election of the remaining members of the committee. There are spaces for both lay and clergy to be elected. Individuals will need to be nominated by a member of Diocesan Synod. More details on this will be sent to the members of Diocesan Synod.

DIOCESAN BOARD OF PATRONAGE -CASUAL VACANCIES

Church patronage has a long history in the life of the church. Patronage is the right to put forward a person to take up a particular type of Clergy post: - to present' a person to a Church of England benefice.

The Diocesan Board of Patronage holds the right of patronage in relation to certain benefices in the diocese, and meets to act as and when necessary, which may be as little as once or twice a year for a short meeting.

There are currently spaces for three clergy and four lay members.

Membership is open to any Clerk in Holy Orders beneficed in or licensed to any parish in the diocese and any lay person aged 16 + and a communicant member of the Church of England. Members are nominated and elected by members of the Bishop's Diocesan Council.

As this election is to fill casual vacancies, the term of office would end in 2027 (it started in 2021).
